### **Key 4 Life Away Day**

I thought the day at Key4Life was an incredible experience for all involved. The horses really brought out a compassionate and brave side of the boys that we rarely see in a school environment.

Naturally, I loved Dave's sessions with the tuning forks and the Imagine visualisation, giving the boys a brilliant tool they can repeatedly use to change their train of thought if they get overcome with emotion or anger etc and even to practise more often to change their daily outlook, using the skill as a proactive tool before they even get to the stage of anger.



I thought Pablo and Daniel's football session was challenging, but again those guys were brilliant at teaching the boys how they can think critically and problem solve for themselves in situations that are presented to them. Also, loved the offer of going for a tour of the Kiyan Prince stadium and maybe watch a QPR game as well. Lovely to have BAME role models for our students as there aren't as many at school.

The day at Key4Life was a real eye-opener. Initially I was dubious as to how some of our students would actually cope with the day, especially as any change in routine can be very awkward. As expected there was some reluctance on the first activity where we had to stand round in a circle, and even with staff joining in some of the students refused to get involved.

Then came horse therapy! I was amazed to see students first leading round ponies, talking to them and getting the ponies to do different things. To be honest I really wasn't expecting this! Then to see students riding the horses around the rink - I couldn't believe the difference in these students who we often see out of class damaging property and being aggressive towards staff.

The same students then actively participated in the other activities organised and engaged well with the leaders and their peers. They also enjoyed the presence of three dogs.












## **Esports Championship**

## **SMSC - Celebrating Japan**






## **Shopping List**

Thank you to Oak class who have brought Michelle her very own bowl of sensory rice, to help calm her when feeling stressed!




# New flooring in the education block toilets




It may not seem a big deal, but having new, clean flooring is very important for hygiene, safety, and well-being.

We have responded to pupil voice, and our ASD learners have asked for a new classroom in a new location. They now have their own ICT suite, bespoke classroom, and sensory garden.


## **New bathrooms for Kennet!**




Two of the four bathrooms on Kennet have been updated so they are fresh and clean, and modern.

The Lower school residential area has been updated during half term with fresh paint to the walls of Courtyard lounge, kitchen, and dining room. Thank you to the site team!






# New space for the MUSIC room

## **Stunning Spray Paintings**




## New signage at NHA!
