Complementing our topic on castles, the children have built some amazing castles out of cardboard during art lessons.




Learning fun!

The children have enjoyed learning through play. They have had fun using the smart-board and playing a variety of games.




We were also very lucky to go on a trip to visit Chepstow Castle – the oldest castle in Europe at over 900 years old!

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Firefighters come to NHA!




What a wonderful day lower school had at Chepstow castle, exploring the ruins, and learning about the history of the castle.





NUMERACY

This term we have learned about 3d shapes by identifying and classifying. We have sorted regular and irregular polygons. We have looked at points of a compass and given instructions. We have converted fractions, percentages and decimals. We have looked at numbers, by ordering numbers and counting in sequences. We have learned to measure and draw angles as well as practising our 4 operations of number.



LITERACY

This term we have been looking at playscripts. We have been reading aloud as a class, sharing opinions and making predictions. We have written about jobs we do around the home. We have also written an advertisement for a school trip. We have created posters about the dangers of smoking and analysed characters. We have discussed qualities that we look for in a friend. Finally we have looked at writing conversations.




MARLBOROUGH




Outdoor education this term we have been spending time at the lake paddle boarding and kayaking. The boys have had great fun improving their skills and cooling off in the fresh water.


