


NUMERACY



> Tom is back at Lackham College to complete the second year of his Animal Care/Horticulture Course and is getting good feedback from the Tutors.



And just like that it's half term, where has the time gone?


Westbury has gone through a lot of changes since last term, new pupils and a new LF, that being me, Sharon.


Our small class consists of Leo, Kayden, and Oakley, and we have had a few ups and downs, but have started to really gel as a team.




