We looked at the meaning of Remembrance Day and talked about why the poppy is the symbol. We made our own wreaths and poppies.




Fridays in Devizes Class continued!

We are very busy on a Friday!




Maths

BROADTOWN CHRISTMAS NEWSLETTER

MATHS—This term we have focused on naming 2d &3d shapes. We have also learned their properties to describe them. We have practised our directional skills and also plotting coordinates.

ENGLISH—We have been reading the novel called Holes. We have completed shared reading activities as well as following the film. The class have really enjoyed the story line. We have completed writing letters and understanding the qualities of each character



DEAR—Our author of term 1 & 2 was Roald Dahl. We have enjoyed group reading sessions where we have read Esio Trot.





Best Festive Classroom of 2023 Competition


Another term completed! So, what have the class been up to?




Year 11 Past and Present




